VANCOUVER CHURCHES SUFFER SANCTUARY FIRES FIRST CONGREGATIONAL UCC INCLUDED



On May 25th around 3:30 a.m., our friends and colleagues in the beautiful Vancouver UCC church faced a sanctuary fire that did enormous damage ("Before" photo on left; fire photo, next page.)

Alarmingly, two other church arsons have occurred around Vancouver to date! The city has set up a church fire "detective" team. Other city churches are on high alert pending arrest of the arsonist or arsonist gang.

Insurance and restoration officials rushed to the UCC church and began restoration plans. A Go-Fund-Me account titled "Save the Ark"(www.gofundme.com/Vancouver UCC) offers a secure place to make donations; 17 people raised over \$1500 the very first day.



Built during the 1970s, the sanctuary was the design of renowned Portland Architect Warren Weber. Controversial from the very beginning, the unique design earned many nick names. Eventually, it became known as "The Ark."

The Vancouver UCC. has grown to be a stalwart of the Central Pacific Conference through a succession of dynamic pastors and members dedicated to peace, activism and social justice. Just as many Central Pacific Conference congregations stepped forward to assist All Peoples at its founding, All Peoples will discuss a contribution toward restoring this landmark sanctuary.

The workshop, Four Doorways to Deepening Worship, lasts all day (9:30 am - 4:30 pm) and costs \$20, which includes lunch. Briefly, the workshop presenter is Adam Kukuk, a musician, composer, and worship consultant. Here is the description of the event from the flyer:

Four Doorways is a daylong event designed to inspire and equip clergy, musicians and lay people; anyone involved in creating worship. Participants leave spiritually refreshed and brimming with new ideas. From hands-on worship to informed, engaged teaching, Four Doorways turns participants into creators empowered with the knowledge that they already have everything necessary to craft vital worship. Participants leave with a blueprint to re-create vital worship at home!

Some of you will remember the Weekleys, David and Deborah, who came over from the Portland area several years ago as visiting pastor and spouse. David played his guitar and sang original music. He shared his journey as a transgender person and ordained Methodist pastor. Significant to his story was the explanation that when the Methodist church banned gays and lesbians from pulpit service, they neglected to include transgender people in the ban. Nevertheless, David took it upon himself to fight for the cause of all LGBT

(QQ) persons'right to serve as Methodist clergy with full standing in the church.

Following the Methodist national conference 8 years ago, when the church steadfastly continued their ban on LG clergy, David, with Deborah faithfully by his side, resigned his service to Methiodist churches in the Portland area in order to return to school for a doctorate of divinity!

It has been a long haul with many eventful side trips. Deborah has kept us informed, via Facebook, throughout the process. And now. the proud day is here.

- From east or west on Hwy 126, go north on 5th and follow south-side directions.
- Finding the Juniper Room—Enter at the main entrance or the next door on the left. Go left to the end of the hall and then right to the first room on left, opposite the rest rooms.
