The Earth Justice people offer a special theme for this year's emphasis.


Food waste has become an enormous problem in our country, and the EPA has come up with a challenge for us to reduce this waste. Many of our churches have ministries that



#### LGBTQ DISCRIMINATION HIDING BEHIND RELIGIOUS FREEDOM LEGISLATION

More states are dealing with proposed legislation permitting religious institutions, individual businesses and corporations to refuse to serve members of the LGBT community on the grounds that it would be against their "deeply held religious beliefs." Most recently, Governor Pence of Indiana signed such legislation. The state is now facing threats of major boycotts if the new law is allowed to stand.

But there is hope in some states. Last year, Arizona backed off in the face of boycotts over an anti-LGBT law. In California, Attorney General Kamala Harris has asked a state court to grant her the authority to prevent just such a ballot measure from appearing on the ballot.

More Jericho Road services coming soon. They are arranging for a shower truck to offer showers to the diners on Thursday afternoons. Also, immunization shots will be available as soon as plans are finalized.

#### A BLOG FROM POGO

Some bloggers are just blowing off steam but others write with maturity and authority. Neil Gordon, investigative blogger for The Project on Governmental Oversight (POGO) works to keep us better informed about "Corporate Welfare Moochers"

Citizen/Christians interested in monitoring our government and participating with compassion on behalf of the needy may wish to take action upon reading some of the data gathered by Mr. Gordon.

Gordon reports, "Two-thirds of the \$68 billion in business grants and tax credits awarded by the federal government since 2000 went to 528 companies." Of that largess, 20% went to just 12 corporations and banks!

The remaining 80% earmarked for boosting job growth and investment went to a "select" group of banks, energy companies and government contractors. These numbers come from the non-profit watch-dog

Good Jobs First. The federal contractors with the most grants and tax credits are: General Electric (\$836.5 million), General Atomics (\$614.7 million followed by United Technologies, Boeing, Lockheed Martin, Honeywell, and Raytheon—each with tens of millions of Pentagon grants.

Gordon goes on to point out that many of these companies have questionable track records in business practices, contract fraud and similar misconduct!

Compounding the picture, many of the companies have either reincorporated abroad or merged with foreign companies to avoid paying U.S. taxes. Gordon points to "Corporate Tax Explorer's" database to show how much recipients of government subsidies paid in federal taxes. The numbers are dismaying... for example, since 2000, GE has paid an average federal tax rate of -9%.

How do these expenditures of our tax dollars care for the poor, free the captives and shelter the homeless?

#### AMERICANS UNITED FOR SEPARATION OF CHURCH AND STATE IN THE NEWS AGAIN

Answers in Genesis (AiG), a fundamentalist Christian ministry is suing a Kentucky office that denied it tax incentives.

Americans United filed a motion to intervene and a proposed motion to dismiss the lawsuit, in federal district court; it wants to prevent taxpayer dollars from being used to unconstitutionally finance a religious ministry.

"A fundamentalist Christian theme park run by a creationist ministry doesn't deserve any form of public assistance," said the Rev. Barry W. Lynn, executive director of Americans United. "Kentucky never should have gotten involved with the Ark Park, but we're going to help get it out of this mess and protect taxpayer money from misuse."
